Instructions for Tintex Fabric Paint

Suitable for painting fabrics and canvas. Ideal for restoring or changing the colour (light to dark) of your outdoor lounges, outdoor umbrellas, directors' chairs, curtains, blinds, canvas awnings etc. Hide dirty marks left by children or pets. Will also cover bleach stains.

Simply paint onto clean dry fabric, dry in the sun and then place in Clothes Dryer on hot for 10 minutes or use a warm Iron with newspaper or paper towel between Fabric and Iron or use a Hair Dryer to set Paint. This product must be heat cured. If the above methods of heat curing are not possible you can also heat cure by wrapping in black plastic and leaving in full sun for a day. A second coat may be required for perfect coverage. Better results will be achieved using two lighter coats rather than one heavy coat. Coverage depending on the fabric is approximately 250mls per square meter.

We recommend that you test a small inconspicuous area first to ensure that the paint will be absorbed into the fabric. Follow the instructions above and if the area rubs clean with a cloth after 24 hours you are ready to commence your project.
